Regulation on deforestationfree products

EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR) aims to ensure that products consumed in the EU do not cause deforestation or deterioration of the state of forests worldwide.


The regulation is to be implemented as of 30.12.2025

Metsä Fibre is committed to sustainable forestry practices and has a dedicated project team to ensure EUDR compliance by December 2025

- For pulp and sawn timber, compliance involves ensuring the wood is deforestation-free, adheres to relevant legislation, and is covered by a due diligence statement.
- The regulation requires businesses to conduct due diligence, risk assessments, and ensure information flow in the value chain.
- Metsä Group is closely monitoring updates to the EUDR regulation, and actively involved in the regulation related discussions and development work



Under the new regulation, it is prohibited to sell or export any relevant commodities or products in the EU unless they meet the following criteria:

Key requirements for companies using products made of wood



1

Reporting obligation starting on 30 December 2025 to prove that

- the products are deforestation and forest degradation free and thus comply with the EUDR requirements
- the products have been produced in accordance with legislation of the country of origin
- the products are covered by a Due Diligence Statement

2

The operator that places commodity on the EU market for the first time has to submit a Due Diligence statement into the EU information System, 'Traces'

 Product, geolocation information, wood species, volumes, production date

against which the EU system confirms a Reference number

3

The reference number received from the EU Information system, 'Traces', must be transmitted to the next downstream operator in the value chain

 The transmission of the reference number can by done by using electronic services, interfaces, e-mails, receipts or invoices



Metsä Fibre's commitment to EUDR compliance

In Metsä Fibre, sustainability and responsibility play an important role in all our activities. Through a rigorous Due Diligence process we ensure that all our products comply with the EUDR requirements.

- The process begins with the wood raw material suppliers. They provide the Due Diligence Statement to the EU Information System "Traces" that generates the unique reference number for the wood. Supplier submits this number to Metsä Fibre
- Metsä Fibre submits the Due Diligence Statement to the EU Information System "Traces", which generates unique reference numbers for Metsä Fibre's pulp / sawn timber
- When selling its products, Metsä Fibre automatically delivers the unique reference number to the customer

Metsä Fibre recognizes the obligations set forth by the EUDR, and is actively preparing for full compliance by 30 December 2025.

During 2025, Metsä Fibre is taking several measures to ensure EUDR compliance. These include

- Actively collaborating with suppliers, customers, authorities and other stakeholders to share relevant information on the EUDR and to ensure timely adaptation to the regulation
- Updating its IT systems to facilitate automatic data transfers and ensure prompt compliance within its supply chain
- · Adapting internal processes








All parties in the value chain need to take actions for EUDR

Delivery of reference numbers


In the first phase, customers will receive the required information (reference & verification numbers) through current delivery documentation:

- 1. Add a reference number to the current delivery documents or create a separate attachment document if necessary.
- 2. Separate CSV file referring to the delivery documentation received by the customer. This delivery method enables customers to automatically import if they have created the capabilities for this. This delivery method is agreed separately with the customer

In the second phase:

- Utilize electronic EDI connections
- 2. Add reference information to the current Metsä Fibre customer portals
